NON-NAVAJO FALL BIG GAME PERMIT SALES PROCEDURES

1. A Non-Navajo General Big Game Permit draw will be held on March 22, 2013. This will occur at the Navajo Nation Museum in conjunction with the Navajo Nation Sportsmen's Expo.
2. Beginning at 8:00 a.m., numbered tickets will be provided to each person that signs in and each person will be required to write their full name on the ticket and drop the ticket into a ticket bin.
3. At 10 AM, no more tickets will be distributed and drawing will begin on issued tickets.
4. Each person is limited to submitting five (5) applications per ticket drawn.
5. Only the person whose name appears on the ticket is authorized to submit hunt applications for purchasing permits.
6. Once a ticket is drawn, the individual whose name appears on the ticket must immediately enter the premises (tent) and purchase their permits. Failure to do this will result in that ticket being disqualified and another ticket will be drawn.
7. As each drawn person completes their purchase, another ticket will be drawn and this process will continue until all permits are sold or until each person with a ticket is given the opportunity to purchase permits.
8. In the event there are still permits available after all tickets have been drawn, the remaining Non-Navajo permits will be sold first-come, first-served until the Leftover Permit Sale Day on July 13, 2013 that will be open to the general public.
9. The Department of Fish and Wildlife developed Left-Over Permit Sale Procedures and these procedures will be used for the Left-Over Permit Sale on July 13, 2013.
10. All Non-Navajo applicants will be screened for eligibility to purchase a Non-Navajo Fall Big Game Permit.
11. A money order or cashiers check, made out to the Navajo Nation, for the full permit cost (application fee and permit fee), must accompany each application.
12. Cash or personal checks will not be accepted.
13. Incomplete applications will not be accepted. Supporting documentation (i.e. proof of Hunter Education) must be attached to the application, if required.
14. Failure to have required fees will result in the application being rejected.
